Who we are

The first Episcopal Church service was held in Manheim in the autumn of 1849. Over the next twenty years such services were held with increasing frequency and in various locations throughout the town. The congregation of St. Paul's was organized on May 8, 1869 and the first Vestry was elected. The cornerstone for our "carpenter gothic" church building was laid on October 29 of that same year. On May 3rd of the following year, 1870, the church building was consecrated. St. Paul's continued as a mission parish until January 25, 1984 when the parish attained full parish status. Over the years St. Paul's has experienced "ups and downs" in terms of membership as well as finances and exists today as a small (ASA of 15) but committed parish family.
